OUR RECOMMENDATIONS:

Plant your trees as soon as possible. Be sure to space them apart (typically 10 feet mini-mum for windbreaks) from other trees, buildings, power lines, etc. Weed barrier fabric can be very helpful in preserving moisture and hindering weed growth near seedling trees. If you are going to use fabric, be sure to use staples to securely pin the fabric into the ground. Water your trees right after you plant them, and then based upon the weather and their conditions, 1-3 times a week after that. To prevent damage from wildlife, small fencing can be used.

CONTAINER:

Container trees range from 6" to 15" in size, including the root ball. There is soil protecting the

root systems, but due to the way which the trees are packaged, it is still recommended that the planter be gentle with the trees.

BARE ROOT:

Bare Root trees range from 12" to 36" in size, with the root ball. Bare Root trees have no soil attached to the root system. When planting Bare Root trees, be sure to be gentle as there is no soil to protect the root system.
